What is the RSA?

The RSA is given by a charity called UNICEF (United Children's Emergency Fund). The charity work hard to help children and their families all over the world. They work hard to ensure that children can enjoy their rights by upholding the UNCRC.

What is the UNCRC?

The UNCRC are the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. This was created by UNicef and includes 54 articles which outline all the rights a child has.

Every child has the right to:

- Survival;
- Develop to the fullest;
- Protection from harmful influences, abuse and exploitation;
- Participate fully in family, cultural and social life.
